

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), also known as Global Goals, are a set of 17 integrated and interrelated goals to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that humanity enjoys peace and prosperity by 2030.

Reporting on the SDGs is important in communicating to stakeholders the organization's commitment to contributing to the Global Goals; claiming accountability and responsibility to take the necessary actions; and measuring progress over time.

SDG Progress Reports cater to a variety of audiences, so it's best to adjust it accordingly. First, identify your target reader. Next, you can shift your focus on what they need to know. For example, your action plans are in the interest of your beneficiaries. Some readers might prefer details like timelines or budgets, while others like your trustees will be more interested in the impact made, the challenges you encountered and the lessons you learned from them.

Your SDG progress report can start with a brief review of your organization's alignment to the Global Goals. It can include the social responsibility and business case for taking action on the SDGs.

Creating a good SDG progress report means being transparent with your audience. Back up your claims with relevant data. Keep your sentences concise when necessary, but dive into detail when it comes to qualitative and quantitative evidence. Remember: this report is a combination of understanding how your mission aligns with global sustainability efforts, and communicating that clearly with the rest of the world.

Alhamdulillah, segala puji dan syukur kami panjatkan kehadirat Tuhan Yang Maha Esa karena atas perkenaan-Nya Buku Laporan SDGs Hub Universitas Indonesia telah selesai disusun dan diterbitkan.

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) atau Tujuan Pembangunan Berkelanjutan (TPB) sudah ditetapkan menjadi arus utama pembangunan di dunia oleh Persatuan Bangsa-Bangsa pada tahun 2015. Kemudian melalui Peraturan Presiden No. 59 tahun 2017 pemerintah Indonesia menetapkan TPB menjadi arus utama pembangunan nasional dan menyusun pedoman pelaksanaannya. Salah satu prinsip penting untuk melaksanakannya adalah No One Left Behind yang artinya TPB dilaksanakan oleh seluruh pemangku kepentingan dan dapat memberi manfaat bagi seluruh masyarakat. SDGs Hub UI berdiri pada bulan April tahun 2019 setelah adanya kunjungan Menteri Perencanaan Pembangunan Nasional Bapak Prof. Dr. Bambang Brojonegoro, MSc dan menanyakan apakah UI sudah memiliki SDGs Center. Selanjutnya beberapa bulan kemudian, atas inisiatif Bapak Prof. Dr. Jatna Supriatna, MSc., ketua SDSN Indonesia-ASEAN sekaligus sebagai Ketua Lembaga Sains Terapan FMIPA UImenghadap dan mendapat persetujuan dari Rektor UI Bapak Prof. Dr. Ari Kuncoro, MSc untuk mendirikan SDGs Hub UI.

Nama SDGs Hub UI dipilih dengan dasar pemikiran bahwa SDGs dengan dasarnya dari sustainability science merupakan ilmu pengetahuan yang dibangun dengan cara interdisciplinary dengan menghasilkan solusi transdisciplinary. Dengan demikian melingkupi seluruh bidang keilmuan, termasuk seluruh aktifitas fakultas dan sekolah serta pusat-pusat penelitian dan kajian yang ada di UI. Lebih dari itu istilah Hub juga dapat dipahami sebagai satu tipikal organisasi yang berjalan tidak dengan formalitas sepenuhnya tetapi lebih sebagai perkumpulan kolegal, fleksibel, efisien, praktis dan lincah (agile) serta terbuka untuk seluruh civitas academica Universitas Indonesia bahkan juga untuk alumninya. Kami dapat berkomunikasi dengan rasa kesatuan diantara para anggota yang berjumlah lebih dari 40 tenaga ahli, saling berbagi pengalaman dan pengetahuan serta juga peluang peningkatan kemampuan di bidang SDGs.

Sampai saat ini berbagai kegiatan-kegiatan internal kampus UI terus diupayakan, baik secara daring maupun luring. Diantaranya melakukan sosialisasi di beberapa fakultas, mendukung kegiatan pendidikan, dan penelitian, pengabdian pada masyarakat. Beberapa prestasi juga telah dicapai, diantaranya pada SDGs Action Awards 2022, UI yang diwakili oleh Green Metric UI berhasil berada di peringkat ketiga diantara perguruan tinggi se Indonesia. Selain itu juga dukungan bagi kegiatan-kegiatan kemahasiswaan yang fokus pada tema kegiatan SDGs. Diantaranya dalam dua tahun terakhir ada pasangan duta SDGs dari mahasiswa/i UI yang dipilih melalui satu proses seleksi dan kemudian para duta SDGs inipun tercatat dalam program SDGs Nasional dikoordinasikan oleh Sekretariat Nasional SDGs (Bappenas).

Selain itu kami juga telah melaksanakan berbagai kegiatan pengabdian pada masyarakat bekerjasama dengan sesama perguruan tinggi dan LSM.

Comprehensive Wealth in Indonesia (on going project)

A study that adopts an inclusive wealth framework to evaluate and measure the stock of produced, natural, human financial and social capital in Indonesia. This data gathering is vital to ensure the production of goods and services needed to maintain well-being and to assess the economic performances is accompanied by sustainability practices.

KLHS RTRW DKI Jakarta 2040 (completed project)

Strategic Environmental Studies (Kajian Lingkungan Hidup Strategis, KLHS) is a study to analyze regulations, updated data and information related to KLHS RTRW Jakarta 2022-2042. Data gathered through literature review, interview and focus group discussion from January - May 2022.

This study aimed to showcase environment expert opinion on the Green Bond Framework of BRI as a requirement of the Green Bond denominated in Rupiah Issuance, which based on the Regulation on Environmentally Friendly Bonds (POJK No. 60 Tahun 2017)

This program is a capacity building series on CE multi-dimensional aspects which is part of SDGs Academy programs and aims to localizing SDGs, transform policy and governance, encourage solutions in order to achieve the SDGs.

Pursuing the theme of "Effective Private Sector Engagement (PSE) in Development Co-operation: Implementing the Kampala Principles at the Country Level-Indonesia", the discussion focused on how businesses in Indonesia engage towards development cooperation partnerships to support SDGs.

In partnership with PT Pegadaian, SDGs Hub UI has assisted its company in developing Green Bond Framework since October 2022. The project is still on-going until January 2023.

Collaboration Project AFS Global STEM Innovators (completed)

ASDGs Hub UI facilitated Bina Antarbudaya with the provision of keynote speaker on SDG and mentors in the event's sustainability workshop on November 11-13 2022. This project is such a significant step to build awareness on sustainability within young generations. SDGs Hub UI believed that discussions over sustainable development should be amplified in other public forums.

Comprehensive Wealth in Indonesia

This study is a partnership between the International Institute of Sustainable Development and its country partner (Indonesia), which is managed by SDGs HUB UI as a lead researcher and collaborates with the Institute for Economic and Social Research (LPEM). SDGs focus carried out by this project are goal number 13, 14, and 15 (Natural Capital), goal number 9 (Manufactured Capital), goal number 3,4,6 (Human Capital), and goal number 8 as the main goal which will be achieved by Inclusive Wealth.

This study aims to promote and establish inclusive wealth measures to move beyond GDP and adopts an inclusive wealth framework to evaluate the extent to which Indonesia has achieved growth at the expense of fast natural resource extraction and increased environmental pollution in violation of basic sustainability criteria. An inclusive wealth framework measures the assets a nation has at its disposal which are useful for the production of output in the economy. This study refines the estimation to the scale of Indonesia by measuring the stock of produced, natural, human, financial, and social capital and the marginal contribution of each capital type. The estimation process will be done with engagement with relevant policymakers to develop an accurate estimation using all available data. The output of the study can be a significant reference for the policymaker to understand its possible future pathways.

The main duties and deliverables carried out by SDGs HUB UI and Institute for Economic and Social Research (LPEM) are as follows (1) Development of CW/IW estimates for the country, (2) Development of policy and investments' recommendation based on the CW/IW estimates, (3) Work with policymakers in the country to support the uptake of CW/IW estimates and recommendations, (4) Provide short inputs/examples to briefing notes and a report on the implications of CW/IW for decision making, (5) Contribute to peer-reviewed articles.

Knowledge Sharing Session

Jakarta Indonesia



On the 8th of September 2022, the Comprehensive Wealth - Indonesian team successfully organized Knowledge Sharing Session. This was the first event held after the Covid-19 outbreak. It took place at the University of Indonesia and attended by representatives from Bank of Indonesia, Central Agency on Statistic of Indonesia, and Indonesian Ministry of National Development Planning. Through this event, the team hoped to gather responses from the mentioned institutions above and the knowledge which transferred by IISD can be used as a recommendation for the policy making process, evaluation and mid-term as well as long term development planning.

Robert Smith, Senior Associate of IISD attended as the main speaker. In his presentation, Mr. Smith highlighted the result of produced capital, as well as introducing the concept of Inclusive (IW) and Comprehensive Wealth (CW) and why it is important to measure the IW/CW. Several best practices regarding the result of inclusive wealth in Canada also shared to the audience. As a closing presentation, representative from team of Indonesia, Robi Kurniawan shared the initial result of Comprehensive Wealth in Indonesia.

KLHS RTRW (Strategic Environmental Studies, Spacial Regional Planning) DKI Jakarta 2022-2042

Kajian Lingkungan Hidup Strategis (KLHS) / Strategic Environmental Studies and Rencana Tata Ruang Wilayah / Spatial Regional Planning 2022-2042 is an effort to analyse policies, planning, and programs in the integrated document of Zoning Plan for Coastal Areas and Small Islands (RZWP3K) to the Regional Regulation Draft, Spatial Regional Planning (Raperda RTRW) Jakarta 2022-2042.

This study was initiated by the government of Jakarta in December 2021 based on Government Regulation (PP) Number 46 year 2016 and Ministry of Environment Regulation Number 69 regarding Procedures for Conducting Strategic Environmental Studies. The government of Jakarta, especially Working Group II KLHS RTRW DKI Jakarta Province 2022-2042 has invited SDGs HUB UI as its supporting partner to gather professional experts in analysing regulations, updated data and information which related to the KLHS RTRW Jakarta 2040. Furthermore, the experts' scope of work were to (1) gather data through focus group discussions and public consultations with public and stakeholders representatives, (2) identify, analyse, and measure the substance of the regulations, planning and/or program (KRP) which potentially affecting the environment, (3) deliver recommendations, and (4) implement the revision of KLHS quality control.

Well known for its environment expertise in research and consulting, PT Dharma Ina Mandiri is a valuable partner of SDGs HUB UI in completing the study of KLHS RTRW Jakarta 2040 as a sub-contractors. Together, Working Group II KLHS RTRW Jakarta 2022-2042, PT Dharma Ina Mandiri, and SDGs HUB UI have completed their study on the KLHS RTRW Jakarta 2040 in due time. The report has been received and acknowledged for its great contribution by the Governor of DKI Jakarta on the 20th June of 2022 through its appreciation remarks on the report.

Public Opinion Survey - SDGs Snapshot ADB

SDGs Snapshot is a report funded by Asian Development Bank (ADB), monitored by UCLG ASPAC. This report showcases a study led by Farrukh Moriani and supported by Dr. Triarko Nurlambang which captured the progress of SDGs implementation at subnational level in Indonesia. The recommendation which was carried out in this report aimed to provide support for national and subnational governments in designing action plan, policy, and programs to accelerate the SDGs Implementation.

As one of the development partners of Indonesia, SDGs HUB UI plays a significant role in this report as a survey conductor. The survey was aimed to capture the public knowledge on the SDGs as well as to obtain public opinion on how the SDGs is implemented in their respective region. The result of the survey will be used as a recommendation and feedback to national and subnational governments towards a more strategic and effective approach of SDGs implementation.

SDGs HUB UI has successfully obtained 604 respondents from 34 provinces across Indonesia which is beyond the target of 500 people. The respondents came from diverse backgrounds of education and occupations as well as age. The youngest respondents were students aged 18 and the eldest were 65 years old and above.

Expert Opinion on the Green Bond Framework of BRI

In March 2022, SDGs HUB UI in partnership with Bank Rakyat Indonesia (BRI) released a report titled Expert Opinion on the Green Bond Framework of BRI. This project is a form of SDGs HUB UI's commitment in accelerating the achievement of SDGs, especially SDGs 6,7,9,11,13 and 15. Through the issuance of Green Bond, it is hoped that green finance becomes a bridge which connects the investors and the SDGs agendas along with providing excellent policy recommendations for the selection, implementation and reporting of Kegiatan Usaha Berkelanjutan (KUBL) or Sustainable Business Activities.

This Framework is a requirement as well as being prepared to translate the Indonesian Financial Services Authority (OJK) Regulation on Environmentally Friendly Bonds (No. 60/POJK.04/2017, referred to as POJK), and thus is in accordance with the relevant existing regulations for the issuance of green bond denominated in Rupiah.

Based on the regulation mentioned, expert opinion is needed to examine the green bond framework of Bank BRI. The opinion was given based on a solid form of assessment which was measured by use of funds, evaluation and selection of projects, fund management, impact reporting, as well as addressing risks and potential hidden problems within the Framework.



Report Writing of the Kampala Principles Action Dialogue

The Kampala Principles Action Dialogue is a seminar engaging development stakeholders in Indonesia to discuss and commit to implementing the Kampala Principles. The Kampala Principles itself aims to boost effective and sustainable development cooperation. This project is a form of our commitment to accelerating the achievement of SDGs No. 16 and No.17. It believes that collaborations among stakeholders not only provide profitable solutions, but also promote an inclusive climate of cooperation.

The discussion summarizes that multistakeholder is an essential approach in achieving the SDGs, but it must be followed by trust, mutual reinforcement, and acknowledging civil rights to produce quality relationships. To give it a critical perspective, we tried to give additional recommendations to the implementation of Kampala Principles: (1) formulating the Kampala Principles Roadmap must distinguish large companies and SMEs; (2) implementing PSE by prioritizing a participatory approach; (3) ensuring that the government provides a policy framework for each collaboration/partnership initiative; (4) putting beneficiaries the communicator for the partnership instead of the private sector; (5) identifying and involving champions and facilitators from local actors; (6) conducting holistic monitoring and evaluation of cooperation with clear measurement indicators; (7) conducting socialization of the Kampala Principles more broadly, both in the context of the region and to the target community; (8) sharing knowledge and best practices in PSE implementation among stakeholders.





This Framework consists of 4 main focuses, namely: (1) Use of Proceeds; (2) Project Evaluation & Selection Process; (3) Management of Proceeds; and (4) Reporting adjusted to POJK 60. The Framework projected to launch on January 2023.

FUNDES will also build small library facilities and donate several books to the target areas, facilitate local MSMEs by fostering digitization in business and assistance towards West Java exhibitions, and support the Sadewa Go Green program.


